Lexys – Rescued in 2011. A workman saw her on her property with a severely damaged front leg. He reported to animal control and they took her from the owner. Her leg needed to be amputated. Had been stripped of skin and badly infected from August 2010 until OS rescued her in Feb 2011. Still waiting for her forever home.



Allee - Rescued in 2007. She was removed from a private individual's home who was doing rescue. The conditions were deplorable. The story appeared on TV and the person was cited and fined. Allee had demodectic mange and was totally bald with open bleeding sores all over her body. She had to have several treatments due to more outbreaks of mange. Allee has gained weight and her skin is totally healed. She has been adopted.



Abby - Rescued in 2007. She was four months old and was homeless due to mange and deformed front legs. Abby was bald and her little body was covered with open sores and scabs. Her front legs were so badly deformed that she needed several casts to correct the deformity. She is fully recovered and her front legs are fine. She has been adopted.



Gracie – Rescued in 2011. Found in the woods in 2010 with newborn pups. She was very thin and very frightened. Diagnosed heartworm positive and will soon begin first treatment. She has been adopted.

Happy Jack – Rescued in 2011. He was a stray that needed rear leg amputated and total ear ablation. Very thin with poor coat. He has found his forever home.



Patrick – Rescued in 2008. He was only four months old, thin, covered with fleas and could not open his eyes due to lids that rolled inward. His owner could not afford to buy him food. He needed several eye tackings until he was old enough for surgery. He is enjoying his “forever home”.



Sharpie – Rescued in 2011. Stray with inflammatory bowel. Emaciated condition. She just joined her new family this month – January 2012.
